Criterion – Organization (20%)

Indicator	Evidence to be provided in application
Ability of organization to deliver WWEST programs that are provided and offered with training	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Relevant experience of the organization and lead applicant • Facilitation staff for initiative is representative of proposed audience, to promote role modelling • Education/experience of staff and how this supports the organization’s science or engineering promotion to young people
Continuity of the organization	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Contributions to the science, engineering and education communities
Budget	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Realistic forecast and clear justification

Criterion – Quality of the Program (40%)

Indicator	Evidence to be provided in application
Program objectives	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Objectives consistent with inclusive programming • Vision is clear and aligns with EDI and STEM goals • Objectives complements and/or supports WWEST Program • Clear description of activity and realistic plans to attain objectives and evaluate impact in 1-year • Demand for program or activity(ies)
Focus on underrepresented groups	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Plans and strategies to make activities inclusive for participants • Plans and strategies to reach specific underrepresented groups

Criterion – Impact and Reach (40%)

Indicator	Evidence to be provided in application
Audience	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Participant reach (age, numbers, demographics) • Geographical reach (i.e., local, regional, provincial) • Transferability to other geographical areas
Impact of program(s) on audience	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Reporting and gathering of metrics is well planned and considers <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1) Quality of the program interaction (number of participants, number of interactions per participant) 2) Participant feedback (testimonials, survey results)
Impact of WWEST funding	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Explanation of the added value or benefits that funding will bring to the organization, its program(s) and, ultimately, its participants
